WHO'S A GOOD CANDIDATE?

These are adults looking to train for good jobs that pay well. They may have just lost their job, have families to support, be looking for a new career path, or just want to start on their dream. Either way, they need skills and experience to succeed.





- · At least 18 years old
- · U.S. citizen or eligible to work

These are young adults who need help finding a job, earning their GED, or enrolling in post-secondary education or training.

- IN SCHOOL: 14-21 years old and low-income
- OUT OF SCHOOL: 16-24 years old
- **BARRIER TO EMPLOYMENT**, such as homeless, pregnant, parenting, offender status, high school drop-out, low basic skills, or disability.

HOW CAN WIOA HELP?









- ASSESSMENTS: aptitude, career interests, math, reading
- **JOB SEARCH ASSISTANCE** during and after training, including applications, resumes, and interview prep
- **EDUCATION ASSISTANCE** for income-eligible individuals
- WORK EXPERIENCE opportunities, internships, and paid on-the-job trainings
- * Priority service given to veterans, low-income, and basic skills-deficient individuals.
